School Mock Drill: A preparedness initiative October 2017 – November 2017

Schools are critical infrastructure entrusted with the responsibility of creating citizens of tomorrow. A safe and secure environment is a prerequisite for effective teaching and learning. Thus ensuring safety of children, teachers and staff members during disasters is necessary. As a major step forward towards realising our vision of "Safer Schools", Assam State Disaster Management Authority in collaboration with District Disaster management Authority, Kamrup (M), National Disaster Response Force (NDRF), State Disaster Response (SDRF) and Fire & Emergency Services is conducting school mock drill in different schools in Guwahati.

The Teachers and Students of all the schools were actively involved in the Drill. The drill started off with sounding of a siren signalling an earthquake of 6.8 in the Richter scale, after which the school students performed the Drop-Cover-Hold and evacuated from the rooms and gathered in the assembly point. A fire incident was also in-acted, wherein the School Principal called the Fire & Emergency Services and the Emergency Control Rooms after which SDRF teams and NDRF displayed their preparedness skills for carrying out response activities. Students and Teachers posing as victims were rescued using various techniques. First Aid was also given to the posed victims in the drill by NDRF. A demonstration on the Fire Safety equipment handling and basic Search & Rescue Techniques was also shown to the students and teachers.

The NDRF team was led by Shri. Surinder Kumar, Asst. Commandant, NDRF 1st Bn and Shri R.C. Bhakat, Senior Station Officer, Panbazar Fire Station led the team of SDRF and Fire & Emergency Services. The entire activity was led by Shri Rajib Prakash Baruah, State Project Coordinator, Assam State Disaster Management Authority, Dr. Mirza Mahammad Irshad, Project Manager, Response, ASDMA, Shri Kaustav Talukdar, District Project Officer, District Disaster Management Authority, Kamrup (Metro) and other officers of Assam State Disaster Management Authority.
